Dear guests,

The volva keeps asking in Voluspå: Do you know enough? And the answer is: No, never! You have proved this by returning to Midgard Talks every year. It has been my pleasure to curate and host the seminars since 2017. Midgard Talks (previously Mimir Talks) was hosted by Midgardsblot until 2022, after which the Midgard Viking Centre took over.

It is nine years since the first edition of Midgardsblot in 2015 here at Borre and Midgard Viking Centre. The first edition in 2014 was called Eidsivablot and took place at Eidsvoll. Since coming here, the festival has often said, that the real headliner is Borre itself with the magical Borre park and the grave mounds. The "Borre beast" is at the back of the Midgardsblot hoodie, but did you know that it is inspired by a little detail from an archaeological find in the Ship mound burial close to the Midgard Centre? You can have a look at it in our exhibitions, and it is also carved into the fireplace in the Gildehall.

Knowledge is always central in Nordic Mythology, and the stories revolve around how to access knowledge or skills of different sorts. Odin sacrifices his eye to drink from Mimir's well of wisdom and hung in Yggdrasil to gain the runes. The volva performed seid and rituals, and the norns knew the fate of both gods and men. The French artist David Thiérrée is doing this year's official artwork for Midgard Talks, and has made his take of the impressive Torbjørg Lillevolve in the Saga of Eirik the Red. She is summoned to the farm Herjolfsnes in Greenland to foresee the future and uses seid to gain the knowledge. We don't know the details as to how our speakers have gained their knowledge, but they have agreed to share, and you are invited!

Please take note of our overall program here at the Midgard Viking Centre during the festival. We have guided tours, Viking crafts courses and a brand-new VR experience. Knock yourself out!

Everybody at the Midgard Viking Centre are eagerly awaiting you and wishes you all a warm welcome 14th - 17th of August 2024.






1238:The Battle of Iceland VR experience


Edvard munch: Towards the forest



He has also done fantasy illustrations, and his works have been featured in numerous exhibitions, books and magazines. He has contributed to a fantasy miniatures game, and has published two art books by Cult Never Dies in 2011 and 2017. He was honoured with a Froud award in 2008. He also illustrated the Mimir Talks seminars during Midgardsblot 2019.
